THE JAPAN INTELSAT CLUB

The JAPAN INTELSAT CLUB was organized 10 years ago, with 45 members who had working contact and close associations with INTELSAT in their working careers. Some were on the staff of COMSAT, COMSAT LABS, or INTELSAT. Other members are contractors who often visited these organizations. All have joined our club to renew friendships from that period, and to continue the exchange of current information about COMSAT AND INTELSAT. - 2) Mr. Tadayoshi Katoh provided an introduction of IRAA to the group and a Video Blog. The information for this was arranged under an agreement between Mr. Simon Bennett of IRAA and Dr. Takurou Muaratani of JIC, with the help of Mr. Ildemaro Rueda and Mr. Alan Olson.
- 3) Mr. Rikuo Koike reported on his experience of working in Vietnam as a representative of the Japanese company. He told us of the life, people, food and history as he had learned of them during his tour.
